Guest Speaker / Kevin McAllister		9/5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Masters in Dune Management along the shoreline. On coastal shoreline sources of sand depending upon prevailing wind drives sand onto beach where it dries (offshore/onshore cycle). Winter storms cyclical and beaches will narrow. Army core does not manage sand across the inlets efficiently. Longshore current drives sand east to west.</li> <li>Explained why the shoals develop inside and outside the in-let.</li> <li>Detailed the impact of seawalls</li> <li>Times article (headline misleading) sand replenishment is a short time measure, very expensive, e.g. \$7M for 2 miles in Quogue.</li> <li>Dredging: where to go for sand .. need beach compatible sand. Logistics: difficult to schedule, lots of competition for dredging equipment up and down the Atlantic Coast.</li> <li>Recommending be cognizant of this issue. We have not had a major storm in years.</li> <li>Example: Fire Island to Montauk (sand replenishment) Army Corp of Engineers. Will be cost sharing arrangement vis-a-vis taxing districts.</li> <li>Recommending: need to understand and plan for future</li> </ul>
