The meeting opened at 8:00 p.m. A motion was made and carried to approve the minutes of the meeting in January as read.

Co-chair Lucy Dunne introduced Chriz Nuzzi and Tom Neely to discuss the intersections of Mary's Lane and Straight Path with Major's Path. The issue was raised by residents in the area who felt that the lack of adequate signage and visibility of traffic entering and leaving both intersections, and recent increases of use of both side roads would inevitably cause serious accidents.

Mr. Nuzzi and Mr. Neely have examined the area and stated that the intersections do present a problem because they are not "squared up" in road design parlance – access and stop signs meet Major's Path on a slant rather than at a right angle as in most intersections. They have also studied traffic flow and accident records. They showed tentative plans to stripe an area between the intersections to move cars further out toward Major's Path, to make them more visible to cars on Major's Path before turning.

CAC members discussed various other ideas including better signage on Major's Path alerting drivers to the intersections, reminding drivers about the speed limit, and generally agreeing the intersections were a problem as currently configured.

Mr. Nuzzi and Mr. Neely will keep the CAC informed as they work out a solution. Ms. Dunne thanked both for coming to the meeting.

The CAC members voted to send a letter to the *Southampton Press* voicing our disapproval of the Day Camp proposal currently before the Town.

With respect to Town Committee reports from CAC members only Ann Reisman reported that she was now the co-chair of the Sustainable Growth Committee and would be reporting on the various projects being considered.

Problems Mentioned:

1. Unsightly piles of garbage at the end of North Sea Road and in the Town Boat Launching area. Garbage bins have been removed. Resident and walkers have complained to the Highway Department with no response.
2. Road drains throughout the North Sea Area have not be cleaned or maintained and this will increase road runoff into bay and creek water.

Members requested that a letter be sent to the appropriate Town Department Heads to request action.

The next Meeting of the North Sea CAC is scheduled for March 12 at 8:00 p.m.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:07 p.m.
