Dwight F. Dunham

Hometown: Sag Harbor

Dunham served in the 127th New York Volunteer Infantry Regiment, known as the "Monitors," in Company K.

On September 8, 1862, at the age of 25, he mustered in with the rank of Private. He transferred to the Veteran Reserve Corps in 1863.

Note: Dunham was from Stonington, CT. He enlisted in Sag Harbor in 1862, but it is unclear if he lived in the village.

He is buried in Stonington, CT.
