## Joseph H. Pedro

Hometown: Sag Harbor

Pedro served in the 48th New York Volunteer Infantry Regiment, known as "Perry's Saints," in Company H.

He mustered in August 1861 at the age of 22, as a Private. He was wounded in action at Drewry's Bluff, Virginia, May 16, 1864 and was discharged for disability June 1st, 1865.

He is buried in Troy, New York.

Maj. W. L. Parsons, of East-Hampton, has been taken prisoner, together with several others of his regiment. He was under Gen. Warren.

Among those wounded in the 48th regiment, not heretofore mention, we learn of Lieut. Roger Edwards of this place (the first volunteer from this village) shot in the leg, and Joseph H. Pedro, of the same regiment, was shot in his right elbow. We are informed by letter that Mr. Pedro is as comfortable as might be expected, under the circumstances.
